107	VALDEZ Maybe? But even that doesn't make sense. It seems like there are much easier ways to get things that are a more reliable payday.	107
108	BANKS So the juice doesn't seem to be worth the squeeze?	108

109	VALDEZ It doesn't. But it's not like I have any experience with black markets, or access to the one that's operating here, so I'm really just speculating.	109

117	VALDEZ I mean, I'm a scientist. I'm supposed to deal with facts, not feelings.	117

125	(interrupting) What makes you so sure it's a threat?	125
126	VALDEZ Well I'm not sure, but I think it's smart to treat it as one until we find out otherwise. Maybe we should talk to Paladin Rahmani, she's probably the best risk assessor we have and she might give us a little clarity there.	126
127	BANKS Hmm no, not yet. She's got enough on her mind, and you're right, this thing is too weird to evaluate in a normal way.	127

136	BANKS Hmm. Well, uh the North Star is the brightest star in the sky, that much I know. People have used it for navigation for, what, millennia?	136

142	VALDEZ I don't even know if he has good days, Alan. This wasn't caused by a disease, it was caused by him going in and tinkering with his mind. I have no idea how it works. And all I can really tell about that from his notes is that it's really, really bad.	142

148	BANKS And that's a problem? Look, what's going on with you two? Just from an operational perspective, I'm not going to ask anything about the personal side of it, okay?	148
149	VALDEZ Fine. She kept things from me, Alan, and that bothers me.	149
150	BANKS Sure, I get that. It'd bother me, too. What did she keep from you?	150
151	VALDEZ Mostly a stuff about the last file on that holotape. Remember how it had a strange filename - "Kirsche" - and she told me that it was a German word that she recognized because her mother was German?	151
152	BANKS Yeah. "Cherry," right?	152
153	VALDEZ Right. Well, it turns out "Kirsche" was a nickname she had in the Vault, because of her red hair. She said she didn't mention that because she didn't want to raise any concerns unless the file turned out to be somehow related to her.	153
154	BANKS Was it? I know she said her friend was going to try to decrypt it; did he have any luck?	154
155	VALDEZ She. And yes, she did. Indirectly, I guess - she took it to someone else - who exactly I don't know - and that person got it decrypted.	155
156	(beat) It turns out, the file wasn't just related to her, it was all about her - it was her full personnel file from Vault 76, including a lot of information that was supposed to be highly classified.	156

	ANDREW	
168	That's encouraging, at least. I'll make it a point to do just that. And soon.	168
169	(beat) We missed you at dinner last night, by the way.	169
170	BETH I know, I'm sorry. Odessa and I were both drained after talking with Dr. Flagler, and I thought it would be best to just make her dinner at my place and relax a bit.	170
171	ANDREW You could've brought her over here! We always have room for more. Oh, but I suppose that could've been awkward.	171
172	BETH That would've been a moot point anyway, since Amanda burst in just as we were starting dessert.	172

173 174	ANDREW She did say that she was meeting her contact after dinner to retrieve that holotape. Wouldn't tell me who it was, and I couldn't seem to figure it out, either. (beat) Must be losing my touch.	173 174
175	BETH You're not. I can't figure it out, either. But whoever it is, they have access to some pretty powerful decryption technology.	175
176	ANDREW Indeed. Well, the reason I'd hoped you'd stop by isn't so you can retrieve your spaetzle. I have information.	176
177	BETH You do? That's brilliant! I have some as well.	177
178	ANDREW I thought so. Charles and I have been working through our contacts. (to Charles)	178
179	Charles, my boy, can you come in here?	179
180	CHARLES Elizabeth! So lovely to see you! I promise that I did not eat your spaetzle.	180
181	BETH You'd better not have! I was already gutted that I didn't get to eat it right after mum made it!	181
182	ANDREW Why don't we start with your news?	182
183	BETH Sure. It may inform what you've found out. Basically, that file that Amanda's friend decrypted, the one named after me it was a full copy of my Vault 76 personnel file.	183
184	ANDREW When you say "full"	184

185	BETH I mean "full."	185
186	ANDREW Even the compartmentalized files?	186
187	BETH Yes. It had things even I didn't know had been recorded. School records, who my friends were, romantic relationships, very specific and very secret aspects of my training it was very thorough.	187
188	CHARLES That's troubling. All of that information should've stayed locked up in Vault 76. Even the Overseer didn't have access to some of the more sensitive compartmentalized information.	188
189	ANDREW What's more troubling is that it was clearly put there by someone who knew that you'd be there when it was found.	189
190	BETH I just realized it's worse than that.	190
191	CHARLES How do you mean?	191
192	BETH Whoever put it there thought I'd be the one to find it. Remember, I specifically waited to go to that location until the Brotherhood sent Odessa. If I hadn't wanted to set up a situation where I could meet her, I would've gone in and found it myself before they'd even got wind of it.	192
193	ANDREW And now they've been drawn into something that whoever's behind this intends to be personal.	193

194	CHARLES This can't be just about her, can it? I mean, no offense, Elizabeth, but this is a hell of a lot of effort just to upset you, I suppose?	194
195	BETH No offense taken, Charles, you're right. This isn't about me, as such, but someone wants me to know about it. But why? I wasn't involved in this project at all; I didn't even know about it until everyone started chasing the tech.	195
196	ANDREW I don't know why. And I'm afraid the information we've gathered doesn't really shed any light on that side of things.	196
197	BETH I guess we'll just have to hope that whoever's doing this shows his cards at some point. Until then I'm going to have to be exceptionally careful.	197
198	CHARLES Please do. This is a radically different situation from what we thought it was.	198
199	ANDREW I'm afraid, though, that you're going to have to put that new level of care into practice right away.	199
200	CHARLES The third lab was broken into and looted several years ago, so the technology and research contained there has escaped our adversary thusfar.	200
201	ANDREW But, based upon some conversations with contacts, along with some chatter Amanda has picked up from patrons at The Spider's Web, we're fairly confident that we may know where it is.	201

202	BETH I take it that it's not in the middle of Charleston with a bow on it?	202
203	CHARLES It is not.	203
204	ANDREW Have you ever heard the name Craig MacAllen?	204
205	BETH I have. Amanda's mentioned him several times. Big underworld boss from Pennsylvania, right?	205
206	CHARLES Right. He and his sister Davina took over the family business after their parents died. They recently expanded their operation here.	206
207	BETH Makes sense. Lots of people to take advantage of now.	207
208	CHARLES Craig and Davina run a bit of a one- stop shop in the Savage Divide. Drugs, prostitution, weapons, that sort of thing. The difference between them and ordinary Raiders or traders, though, is that they cater specifically to high-end clientele.	208
209	ANDREW They offer specialized services, shall we say. Whatever a client's desires, no matter how depraved, they generally find a way to fulfill them. Bespoke weapons, highend drugs, um exotic sexual partners	209
210	BETH (agitated) I hate them already.	210
211	ANDREW Lily, I need you to stay focused. (beat) (MORE)	211

212	ANDREW (CONT'D) At any rate, they recently began offering a new service, but they're keeping it very, very quiet. That's why we're one step ahead, for now. They've begun trafficking in experiences.	212
213	BETH It sounds like they already do that.	213
214	ANDREW Not like this. They're using technology that allows people to directly relive the experiences of others, via memories that had been recorded on some sort of high-capacity holotapes.	214
215	BETH That definitely sounds like the sort of thing Project Mind's Eye could be used for.	215
216	CHARLES We're not making any assumptions, but that certainly seems like the most likely possibility. Another, though, is that they simply heard about the technology and are luring people in with the intention of cheating them out of their caps.	216
217	BETH An underworld boss certainly wouldn't be above that sort of thing.	217
218	CHARLES But there's only one way, by our reckoning, to find out. You need to go undercover and find out what's going on.	218
219	BETH That should be fun. What am I up against?	219
220	CHARLES Well, it's a much more sophisticated operation than your typical Raider outfit. So you'll need to be on your toes more than usual.	220

223	CHARLES I'm afraid not. Both Craig and Davina know her, and it's likely that some of the patrons at their establishment will as well.	223
224	BETH You want me to take <i>Odessa</i> undercover with me?	224
225	ANDREW Will that be a problem? I know she's not a trained intelligence operative like you, but she has the kind of skillset that should fall somewhere between "beneficial" and "indispensable" given the nature of the operation.	225
226	BETH I'll ask her when I talk with her at Atlas, but we did not leave things in a good place last night.	226
227	ANDREW What happened?	227
228	BETH I was a bit too cagey with information and it blew up in my face when Amanda burst in. I hadn't told her that Kirsche had been one of my nicknames, and I didn't let on at all about my relationship with Amanda.	228
229	CHARLES The latter bit makes sense. It would be one thing if you were still together, romantically, but going into any sort of detail there likely wouldn't have done anything but introduce unnecessary complications.	229

232	CHARLES We've backstopped undercover identities for both of you, with Amanda's assistance. You're a wealthy couple from the Northeastern part of Pennsylvania; they're from the opposite corner, so that should forestall any uncomfortable conversations about why they weren't aware of you previously.	232

234	CHARLES You're Alice Halstead and Miss Valdez will be Courtney Fonseca.	234

236	CHARLES I've taken care of getting your names on the entry list. 15,000 caps each will get you through the door.	236

238	CHARLES They have a special, very exclusive tier, and that's the entry fee. You need to be in that tier. Amanda's arranged to have a couple of her employees do the heavy lifting for you. They'll leave as soon as the exchange is complete to ensure they're not recognized. (beat)	238
239	Once you're in, Craig or Davina will probably vet you. But I'm sure you'll navigate that without issue.	239

241	CHARLES Their new endeavor seems to be mostly centered around sex, so steer the conversation in that direction. They'll likely try to get you to try a romp with one of their metahumans or something like that, but try to get them to volunteer the existence of the "experience" we're looking for.	241
242	ANDREW You'll have to be subtle about it, of course.	242
243	BETH Of course.	243
