23	DR. HOLCOMB No. Once a subject is inside the simulation forcibly bringing them out of it is too much of a neurological shock. It's like the old wives tale about waking up a sleepwalker, except well, this isn't an old wives tale. It will kill them.	23

25	DR. HOLCOMB There's nothing we can do. At this point, it's all up to them.	25
26	VALDEZ "All up to them?" What do you mean?	26
27	DR. HOLCOMB They have to bring themselves out of the simulation. The problem is that the person's mind knows something's gone wrong, and it tries to compensate. That creates a conflict with the pod's programming, and results in what's called a Hofstadter-Moebius loop.	27
28	VALDEZ A Hofstadter-Moebius loop is only supposed to happen within an <i>artificial</i> intelligence, not in humans.	28

36	DR. HOLCOMB I'm going to open the pod. I don't want to risk overstimulating her and exacerbating things, so let's start by having you hold her hand.	36

55	DR. HOLCOMB Why did you call her "Beth?"	55
56	VALDEZ It's um it's her middle name.	56
	DR. HOLCOMB (suspicious)	
57	I see (beat)	57
58	Just keep holding her hand for now. She's stable, but we're still working with a limited amount of time.	58
59	(beat) Tell me about her. What's she like?	59
60	VALDEZ Um well, she's passionate. Loyal. Smarter than she gives herself credit for. And she's tough. She had a lot of trauma growing up. It's been hard for her at times.	60
61	DR. HOLCOMB But now she has you.	61
62	VALDEZ (wistfully) Yeah.	62
63	DR. HOLCOMB What's wrong?	63

64	VALDEZ I I feel like I just found her, and now I'm afraid that I'm going to lose her.	64
65	DR. HOLCOMB Try not to think like that. Just be here for her. I know this probably isn't something a scientist should say, and I certainly don't have any evidence to back it up, but I think it helps.	65

73	(choking up) She's dying.	73
74	DR. HOLCOMB I've never seen a loop behave this aggressively. I'm I'm sorry. I think you should say your goodbyes.	74

75	VALDEZ I'm not ready to say goodbye!	75
76	DR. HOLCOMB I know. We never are. But you're going to regret it if you don't.	76
77	VALDEZ The only thing I'll regret is if I stop fighting.	77
78	DR. HOLCOMB Then fight. And I hope you win.	78
79	VALDEZ Beth! Wake up! Please, wake up! You can't leave me now! I'm sorry I was so hard on you, I'm just afraid of having my heart broken again. But the only thing I'm afraid of right now is losing you! Just wake up!	79
80	DR. HOLCOMB This is new	80
81	VALDEZ What's happening?!	81
82	DR. HOLCOMB Her brain activity spiked again, a few seconds after you stopped talking. That's usually the brain's last gasp before the subject dies. But	82
83	VALDEZ But she's still alive.	83
84	DR. HOLCOMB Not only that, her vital signs are returning to normal. Well, normal- ish. There are still some spikes, but they're not as acute as what we were seeing when things went sideways.	84
85	VALDEZ Does that mean she's going to wake up?!	85
86	DR. HOLCOMB I I don't know. This is all new ground for me. (MORE)	86

	DR. HOLCOMB (CONT'D) I've never seen someone wake up when they were that far gone. (beat)	
87	Courtney, you need to prepare yourself. If she wakes up, there's a strong possibility of neurological damage. It could be temporary, it could be permanent; it could be minor, it could be serious. Or maybe there won't be any damage at all. But you need to be prepared for the possibility that there is. Okay?	87
88	VALDEZ I'm not going to give up on her, no matter what.	88
89	DR. HOLCOMB Good. She's going to need you.	89
90	VALDEZ When will we know?	90
91	DR. HOLCOMB I'm not sure. I'm sorry.	91
CRAIG retu	irns, pushing a cart.	
92	CRAIG I hope this is enough water. I had Henry boil as much as I could transport.	92
93	DR. HOLCOMB Thank you, Craig.	93
94	CRAIG What's our status?	94
95	DR. HOLCOMB We're not sure. Miss Halstead passed the point of no return - or what we thought was the point of no return, at least - but she's still with us. Unconscious, but still with us nonetheless. Her vital signs are reasonably close to normal.	95

106	DR. HOLCOMB Yes, I'll give her an analgesic. That should take care of her headache and allow her to relax. Her brain is still coming down from that spike. (beat) (MORE)	106

107	DR. HOLCOMB (CONT'D) Craig, can you give us the room? I want to limit the number of voices she hears until we can ascertain the level of neurological trauma she's suffered.	107
108	CRAIG Uh, sure is that why she's speaking in an English accent? Neurological trauma?	108
109	DR. HOLCOMB It must be. Trauma can manifest itself in a variety of different ways.	109
110	(beat) I'll come get you when I have an update. But the fact that she woke up at all is highly encouraging.	110
111	CRAIG Did you record the data from the session?	111
112	DR. HOLCOMB I did. And it may provide insight on how we can bring people back if they get stuck in a loop.	112
113	CRAIG I hope that's the case. Thank you, Doctor. We'll talk later.	113
	CRAIG leaves and closes the door.	
114	DR. HOLCOMB Beth, I'm going to give you something to make you feel better, okay?	114
115	BETH (strained) Okay. Thank you.	115
	DR. HOLCOMB gives Beth a chem through her IV.

117	(beat) Alright. I know who she is, but who are you?	117
