25	CINDY That must be the Colonel again. She might have an update. I'll be right back.	25

29	ODESSA Beth sent that message in code for a reason.	29

42	AMANDA Yeah. Knowing a coded message was coming always made me clench, too. But she's okay, and she wants us to do a little legwork until she gets back. That message would've been very different if she felt she was in danger.	42

61	ODESSA (more amused than upset) Were you planning on mentioning that at any point, Amanda?	61

63	ODESSA I do think that Craig may have some information we can use, but he's not due back in town until tomorrow. He told us he had some "family business" to attend to last time we were at the club.	63
64	<pre>(beat) Wait his family is originally from that area. Not Pittsburgh itself, but not far from there.</pre>	64

ODESSA enters the club. There are a few patrons, but it is mostly quiet. She sits at the bar and CRAIG approaches.

83	I hope it is. But I'd like to get your insight. You understand the Pitt better than anyone I know.	83
84	CRAIG It still hurts to hear it referred to by that name. I know it's an accurate description, but still.	84
85	ODESSA I'm sorry.	85
86	CRAIG As am I. But it's alright. This war, and how people have dealt with its fallout have taken something from all of us. And others well, it's taken everything from them. (beat)	86
87	So. How can I help?	87
88	ODESSA Let's talk in private.	88

89	CRAIG Of course.	89
	ODESSA and CRAIG go downstairs to CRAIG's office.	
	CRAIG closes the door.	
90	ODESSA Beth is missing.	90
91	CRAIG Missing?! This is more serious than I thought.	91
92	ODESSA Do you know a Union operative in the Pitt named "Hex?"	92
93	CRAIG (a bit curt) Yes, I know Hex.	93
94	ODESSA I take it you don't get along?	94
95	CRAIG I wouldn't put it that way. We have different goals. And that can make it difficult to collaborate, even when our interests align. Especially when one party is as bull-headed as her	95
	ODESSA chuckles.	
96	ODESSA That fits Beth's description.	96
97	CRAIG Is she involved in Beth's disappearance?	97
98	ODESSA Not directly. But Hex was the last person who saw her before she ran off with an unknown person for unknown reasons.	98
99	CRAIG Hmm. Well, I'm not sure what I can do, but I'm happy to help in any way I can. (MORE)	99

CRAIG (CONT'D)

I do still have a reasonably strong network of contacts up there, and I'll get in touch with them immediately...

100	ODESSA Thank you. And I'm sure that will help. But that's not the reason I wanted to talk to you about this.	100
101	CRAIG Oh? What is ? Now you really have my attention.	101
102	ODESSA Beth left a coded message with Hex. She told me not to worry, and also that I should speak with you.	102
103	CRAIG And I take it she didn't say why.	103
104	ODESSA Unfortunately, no, she didn't. But given the context have you heard of the Order of the Emerald Pike?	104
105	CRAIG Oh, yes. They're an interesting bunch. But they don't seem like the types to be involved in something like that.	105
106	ODESSA Why do you say that?	106
107	CRAIG They're not like Mothman Cultists; they mostly keep to themselves.	107
108	ODESSA Yes. To the point that I'd never even heard of them until a couple of days ago.	108
109	CRAIG That's all down to how they operate - not so much "in the shadows" as "completely out of sight," at least until they take action. I've never been able to get a feel for what they want, and believe me, I've tried.	109

110	ODESSA When you say "take action," what do you mean? What kinds of things do they actually do?	110
111	CRAIG That's just it. There's no pattern. And it's turned them into almost a ghost story.	111
112	ODESSA A ghost story? What do you mean?	112
113	CRAIG They seem to exist at the periphery of major events, and it's been that way for a very long time.	113
	ODESSA	
114	How long?	114
115	CRAIG Centuries, best I can tell. (beat)	115
116	When I was a kid, I was fascinated by secret societies, and these guys were kind of a pet project of mine for a few years. They're very good at hiding themselves, but you can spot them if you know what you're looking for and they pop up occasionally throughout history.	116
117	(beat) With something like that, it can be hard to separate fact from fiction. People build up a mythology around them. There are ebbs and flows to it, and when they go back to lurking in the shadows people start to fill in the blanks themselves.	117
118	ODESSA Pattern recognition. Our brains are wired to recognize patterns as a survival instinct. There are several competing theories on how it works, and Piaget's research on the topic is especially fascinating	118
	CRAIG (interrupting)	
119	(interrupting) Odessa	119

120	ODESSA Sorry. This would've been easier if I was still "Courtney."	120
	CRAIG chuckles.	
121	CRAIG You can be anyone you want here.	121
122	ODESSA None of this tracks with what we're seeing. Paladin Rahmani briefed me on intel they'd received specifically about them. It wasn't much, but she knew who they were and that they were worth keeping an eye on.	122
123	CRAIG Did she tell you where she got that intel?	123
124	ODESSA Not directly. But they ended up on our intelligence division's radar somehow.	124
125	CRAIG And that intel made its way to you.	125
126	ODESSA What are you saying?	126
127	CRAIG I'm saying that when a group that's managed to keep itself mostly secret for this long suddenly makes itself known, it's probably not a coincidence.	127
	ODESSA sighs.	
128	ODESSA That, unfortunately, is a good point.	128
129	CRAIG Also unfortunately, my notes were lost during the war. So all we have to go on is whatever's still rattling around up here.	129

130	ODESSA That's going to be a lot more than we know right now. Are they violent?	130
131	CRAIG Oh, no, they're not violent at all.	131
132	ODESSA Why would a group that's not violent name themselves after a weapon?	132
133	CRAIG A weapon? I don't understand.	133
134	ODESSA They named themselves after a medieval pole arm. That doesn't exactly scream "non-violent" to me.	134
135	CRAIG Oh! I see. Not that kind of pike.	135
136	ODESSA I'm listening	136
137	CRAIG It's "pike" like "turnpike." A highway. The original Latin is "Ordo Via Viridis" - "Order of the Green Highway," basically.	137
100	ODESSA (mildly frustrated)	100
138	Why didn't they just say "highway?"	138
139	CRAIG One thing I learned in my research is that some translators rarely pass up an opportunity to get flowery.	139
140	ODESSA Well, "Green Highway" isn't violent, but it's no less confusing.	140
141	CRAIG Imagine researching these guys for more than a decade.	141

	ODESSA	
142	As much as I enjoy research, I'd rather not.	142
CRAIG	laughs.	
143	CRAIG I don't blame you. I spent a lot more time than I probably should have just trying to figure out if that specific translation had a hidden meaning. I eventually decided that it was just a 17th Century translator showing off. (beat)	143
144	Something's bothering you.	144
145	ODESSA I'm just worried about Beth. I know, she told me not to be, but I can't help it.	145
146	CRAIG We always worry about the people we love. There's no avoiding it. Davina and I worry about each other all the time.	146
147	(beat) Do you have any siblings? Back in California?	147
148	ODESSA No. I'm an only child. I was only a toddler when the bombs fell. After that, building the Brotherhood and just surviving put any plans my parents might've had to grow the family on hold and, well	148
149	CRAIG They never quite got around to it.	149
150	ODESSA Yeah. But I never sensed that they regretted it. It's one of the things that Beth and I have in common. Not the "only child" thing, but having parents who always loved us. Unconditionally.	150
151	<pre>(beat, wistful) Maybe I'll get to see them again someday</pre>	151

152	CRAIG I hope you do. I'm sure they miss you as much as you miss them.	152
153	ODESSA (changing the subject) Um back to the topic at hand.	153
154	CRAIG Yes, of course.	154
155	ODESSA Would you be willing to talk to Knight Carlson? He's the lead on this whatever this is and talking to you directly would be a lot more efficient than doing it through me.	155
156	CRAIG I'm willing to do it as a favor to you and because it might help Beth, but I want to reiterate that our arrangement does not include me or my sister becoming Brotherhood assets.	156
157	ODESSA I understand. And thank you.	157
158	CRAIG Now it's my turn to ask you for a favor.	158
	ODESSA	
159	(wary) What is it?	159
160	CRAIG Have lunch with us. It's been ages, and Davina is dying to catch up.	160
161	ODESSA If I can use your radio to make the arrangements with Knight Carlson first, you've got a deal.	161
	CRAIG chuckles.	
162	CRAIG Of course. Right this way.	162

ACT TWO

INT. FORT ATLAS, DAY

Knight CARLSON is in his office, clacking away at a terminal.

DEREK arrives and knocks on the doorway.

163	DEREK Knight Carlson, I hope I'm not interrupting.	163
164	CARLSON Not at all, Paladin Hewitt. What can I do for you?	164
165	DEREK I just wanted to check in and make sure that Knight Foster is treating you well.	165
166	CARLSON He's been great. And it's been illuminating to work with another experienced Knight, from back at Lost Hills. I only worked with Knight Shin briefly before he left.	166
167	(beat) Can I ask you something, Paladin?	167
168	DEREK Only if you call me Derek. I don't stand on ceremony.	168
169	CARLSON Okay Derek.	169
170	(beat) You knew Scribe Valdez back in California, right?	170
171	DEREK Er, yes, I did.	171
172	CARLSON What was she like?	172
DEREK chu	ckles ruefully.	
173	DEREK She was amazing. Hell, she's been amazing as long as I've known her.	173

174	CARLSON How long have you known her?	174
175	DEREK Pretty much our entire lives. We grew up together.	175
176	(beat) Here, let me show you something.	176
	DEREK reaches into one of his pockets and pulls out a picture. He hands it to CARLSON.	
177	DEREK (CONT'D) Is that her? She's so young!	177
	DEREK chuckles.	
178	DEREK (CONT'D) That was in 2096. She was 21, I was 23. It seems like forever ago.	178
179	CARLSON Who are the other people in the picture?	179
180	DEREK Well, those are her parents on the left, and my parents on the right. And that's me right there next to her. It was a Brotherhood event to celebrate my promotion from Initiate to Knight.	180
181	CARLSON I didn't even know the Brotherhood held events for that kind of thing.	181
182	DEREK They don't, usually.	182
	DEREK sighs.	
183	DEREK (CONT'D) My parents insisted. I was embarrassed, I didn't want that kind of attention. At least I was able to convince them to keep it small.	183
184	CARLSON It looks like you had a great time anyway. Your parents look very proud. Odessa does, too. You two must've been close.	184

185		DEREK Yeah. We were.	185
186		CARLSON I bet it was hard when she left.	186
187		DEREK (slightly uncomfortable) It was. Still is, in a lot of ways.	187
188		CARLSON I'm sorry, I didn't mean to pry!	188
189		DEREK It's alright, Knight Carlson.	189
190		CARLSON Call me Greg. It's only fair.	190
	DEREK chuc	kles.	
191		DEREK Okay, Greg. But really, it's fine. I know us being here is going to lead to a lot of questions, and I'd rather people ask them than speculate. That kind of thing can be deeply harmful for morale. (beat) So to your original question, she's the most amazing person I've ever known. I mean that literally. There	191 192
		wasn't a single day that she didn't do something that left me in awe of her. Big stuff, small stuff, it didn't matter.	
193		CARLSON Wow. I hope I have a friend that talks about me like that someday.	193
194		DEREK I hope you do, too. And if you do well, my advice is to do everything you can to hold onto that friendship.	194
195		CARLSON Yes, sir.	195
	DEBEK and	CART.SON laugh	

DEREK and CARLSON laugh.

196	DEREK You'll never find a better mentor than Odessa Valdez, that much I know. As a Scribe or as a person.	196
197	CARLSON So many people admire her. And that's created its own problems, but she even handles that with the kind of grace I never could.	197
198	DEREK What kind of problems?	198
199	CARLSON People seem to develop what's the word she uses? "Parasocial relationships" with her.	199
200	DEREK I'm sorry, I'm not familiar with that term.	200
201	CARLSON She's effectively a celebrity out here, even though that's the last thing she wants. Everybody loves her. And that leads some people to think they have an actual, like, personal relationship with her.	201
202	DEREK Oh. I can see how that could lead to problems.	202
203	CARLSON Most of them are harmless enough. They think Odessa is their friend because they've had a handful of interactions and she was polite to them.	203
204	DEREK "Most of them?" What about the others.	204
CARLSON s	ighs.	
205	CARLSON There have been a few who well, they thought there was, you know, a romantic connection. (MORE)	205

206	CARLSON (CONT'D) Some of them pursued that, and sometimes they didn't want to believe her when she said she wasn't interested. (beat) She always put on a brave face, but it bothered her. She's so much more than that, but people kept coming in here and asking her out, like that was all she had to offer. Fortunately, that's mostly died down now that everyone knows she's not only with somebody, but somebody who can make them disappear.	206
207	DEREK Wait. Is Beth a mercenary or something? Is she dangerous? I didn't want to ask too many questions when we talked, but	207
208	CARLSON (interrupting) Oh, no, it's nothing like that. Beth has kind of built up her own reputation in Appalachia. She's not someone you'd want to mess with, and she loves Odessa. Fiercely.	208
209	<pre>(beat) It's great to see how protective you still are of her. You're a good friend.</pre>	209
210	DEREK Thanks. I tried to be.	210
211	CARLSON Tried? I might be overstepping a little bit, but it seems like you shouldn't be using past tense. I mean you came all the way here and based on how you talk about her it seems like that friendship might be a big part of why you're here.	211
212	DEREK That's an astute assessment.	212
213	CARLSON If you're ever up for telling stories about Odessa, I'm all ears. They don't even have to be embarrassing ones.	213

DEREK laughs.

214	CARLSON (CONT'D) But the look on your face tells me that you are not up for doing that right now.	214
215	DEREK That is an accurate assessment, Scribe. Well done.	215
216	CARLSON There's something else I'd like to talk to you about, if it's okay.	216
217	DEREK Sure. What's up?	217
218	CARLSON I don't know the backstory, but my guess is that there is one. But if there's one thing I hope you see while you're conducting your assessment, it's that we're building something really important here. Something good. And it's something worth keeping.	218
219	DEREK Well, with the caveat that we haven't been here that long, everything we've seen so far supports that. Hell, we started hearing stories when we were hundreds of miles away. People out there know the name of the Appalachian Brotherhood of Steel. You've built up quite a reputation in just a few years. It's impressive. And the quality of the people who are joining your cause is a further demonstration of that.	219

222	(beat) Thanks for the talk. I have to have a quick conversation with Paladin Rahmani, then I think I'm going to explore a little.	222

223	CARLSON Appalachia is a fascinating place. Have fun! But be careful, okay?	223
224	DEREK I will.	224
	INT. BETH & ODESSA'S HOME, AFTERNOON	
	DEREK rings the doorbell. ODESSA walks to the door and answers it.	
	ODESSA	
225	(surprised) Derek! What are you doing here?	225
226	DEREK I thought it would be a good idea to wander around Appalachia on my own. Really get a <i>feel</i> for the place.	226
227	ODESSA (skeptical, smiling) Mmm-hmm. You've never "wandered around" in your life.	227
228	DEREK Okay, I wanted to check in on you.	228
	ODESSA chuckles.	
229	ODESSA That's better.	229
230	DEREK Leila told me where I could find you. She said it would be ok. She tried to get you on the radio, but you didn't answer.	230
231	<pre>(nervously) If it's not okay, I can just go back to Fort Atlas</pre>	231
232	ODESSA It's fine. Come in.	232
	DEREK enters the home. ODESSA closes the door.	
233	DEREK Still no word from Beth?	233

234	ODESSA Nothing yet. I've had my radio locked on the frequency the Enclave is using to keep me updated on their search.	234
235	DEREK How are you holding up?	235
ODESSA si	lghs.	
236	ODESSA As well as can be expected, I guess.	236
237	(beat, changing the subject) How are things at Fort Atlas?	237
238	DEREK They're great, actually. Dave is working with the junior scribes and Randall has been huddling up with Knight Merriweather. They're already acting like old pals.	238
239	ODESSA I had a feeling they'd get along.	239
240	DEREK Dave's ready to go home already, but I might have to pry Randall away with a crowbar. He likes it here.	240
ODESSA la	aughs.	
241	DEREK (CONT'D) I was talking to your protege.	241
242	ODESSA (wary) You talked to Jess? About what?	242
243	DEREK Mostly making sure that she and Dave were getting along.	243
244	ODESSA Are they? The whole Dave experience can be a little jarring if you're not prepared for it.	244

DEREK laughs.

	DEREK	
245	You're not wrong about that. But they're getting along fine. And he's having a blast with the other junior scribes, too. (beat)	245
246	All three of us are kind of a novelty, so that helps.	246
247	ODESSA What else did you and Jess talk about? You said "mostly."	247
248	DEREK Well we also talked about you.	248
249	ODESSA Derek! You didn't	249
250	DEREK (interrupting) No, I didn't. As far as she or anybody else at Atlas knows, other than Leila, of course, we were just close friends who served together.	250
251	ODESSA Good.	251
252	DEREK I did kind of, maybe show her the picture of us at my Knighthood ceremony.	252
253	ODESSA Not the one where I'm making moon eyes at you!	253
253 254	ODESSA Not the one where I'm making moon	253 254

256	DEREK Yeah. I know it's hokey, but I guess it was to remind myself of the kind of thing we're fighting to preserve. That no matter how ugly this world gets, there are still some things worth fighting for.	256
257	ODESSA (feigning tenderness) Oh, Derek but I guess you're right.	257
258	(beat, a modus) It <i>is</i> hokey.	258
	DEREK laughs.	
259	DEREK That's not the only reason I kept it.	259
260	ODESSA (softly) I know.	260
	DEREK clears his throat.	
261	DEREK So. Speaking of things worth fighting for, what can I do to help?	261
262	ODESSA You mean to find Beth?	262
263	DEREK Yeah. Anything you need, name it.	263
264	ODESSA Well right now it's mostly in the hands of the Enclave since they already have personnel on the ground, and based on what Cindy said	264
265	DEREK Cindy? I'm sorry, I'm still getting used to names and faces.	265
266	ODESSA Oh, that's right. You haven't met her. She's an Enclave officer and Amanda's girlfriend.	266

267	DEREK And I take it she's a friend of yours as well?	267
