111	HARBINGER We found that if we bled off entropy into other universes, we could delay what we'd thought was inevitable.	111

113	HARBINGER That was not our intent. We thought that we could siphon a relatively small amount to a large number of universes, and the impact would be minimal, on a cosmic scale.	113
